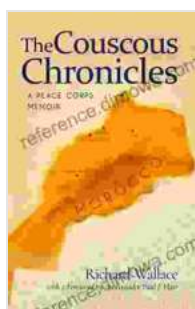


# The Couscous Chronicles: A Peace Corps Memoir That Will Leave You Hungry for More

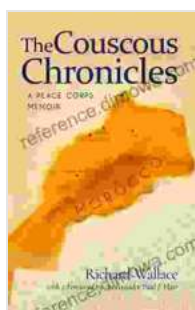

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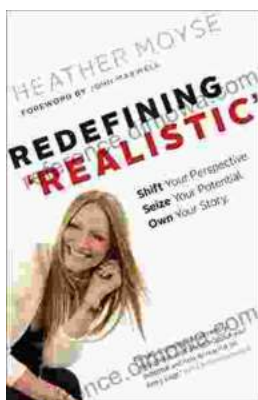


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
