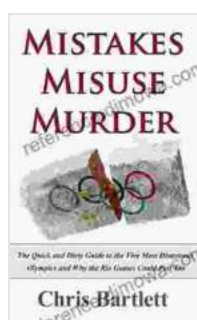

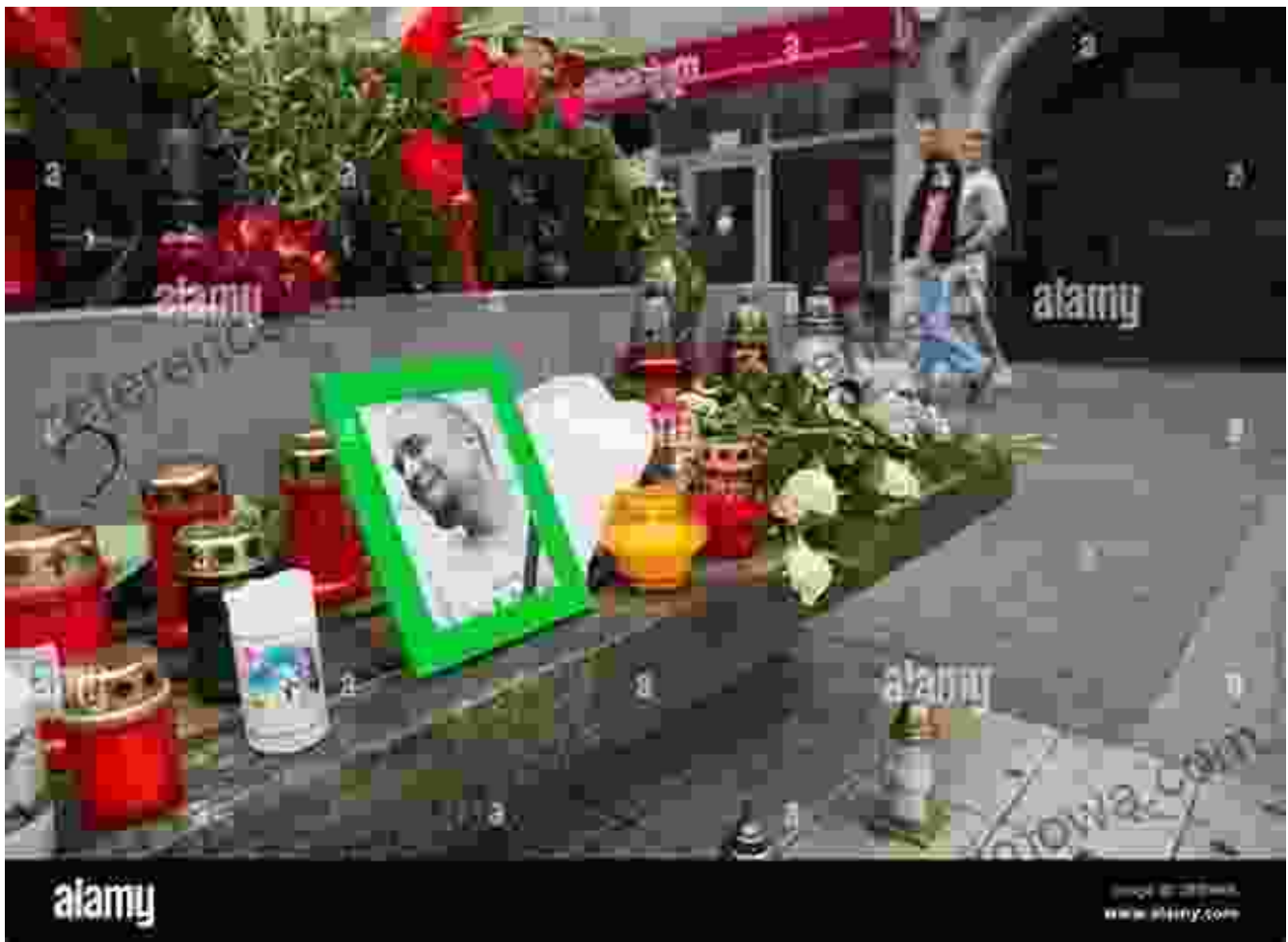
The bombings were the work of Eric Rudolph, a white supremacist who was later convicted of the attacks and sentenced to life in prison.

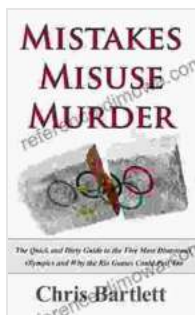

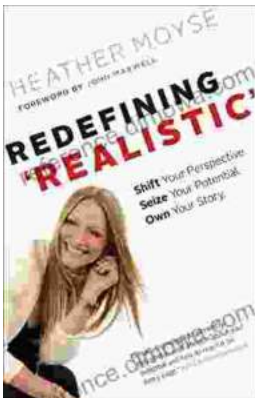

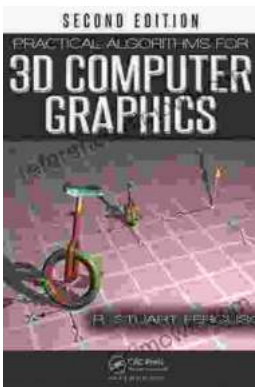
